Since the 2<sup>nd</sup> May, the new refuse collection days have been in force. The household refuse in Croissy is collected twice a week and plastics and paper once a week. For Glass and garden waste, see the table below. Did you know that our household refuse is incinerated and used to provide electricity?

This guide also details where you could leave items for charity such as the Red Cross or an organisation called EMMAUS, plus the address of the local tip

**In the household refuse (grey lid) put:**

- Non recyclable glass such as light bulbs and glasses.
- China and earthenware.
- Polystyrene containers
- Disposable nappies and wipes
- Food containers with leftovers.



**Glass (green lid)**  
Glass bottles and jars (remove lids and corks)  
**Don't include low energy and neon light bulbs, mirrors, window panes, glasses.**



**In the bin with the yellow lid put plastic containers, tin cans, newspapers and magazines**

- Plastic bottles
- Tin cans, aerosols, foil trays.
- Cartons

**Don't include yoghurt pots and plastic bags.**

**Garden waste in the brown bin**

- Dead leaves and flowers
- Hedge trimmings
- Grass cuttings
- Small branches less than 10cm in diameter and 1m20 long

**Don't include earth, tree stumps, or large branches.**



**The "encombrants"**  
(large items) are collected one Saturday a month depending on where you live, from outside your house.
